Inheriting the Spirit of Hiraza! (Cont'd fr P.1)

These casual and pleasant gatherings bring to mind the personality of Rennyō Shōnin (1415-1499), the eighth head abbot (Monshū) of our Hongwanji sect. In the book *The Sayings of Rennyō Shōnin* (Rennyō Shōnin Goichidai-kikigaki), we can find the word “sake” three times:

On occasion, Rennyō Shōnin would serve sake or present gifts in the spirit of gratefulness to attract people with such hospitalities and then share the Buddha Dharma with them...Rennyō Shōnin would say that on cold days we should be sure that warm sake was provided to the members who visited him in Kyoto so that it makes them forget the cold during their journey;... and also on warm days, he would say to us to make the sake cold.



I know that there are some of you who might think that sake and Buddhism aren't compatible. But Rennyō would serve hot sake to those who visited him on cold days and chilled sake on warm days as a way to show appreciation for their service and to share the Nembutsu teaching with them in a heart-to-heart talk. In reading these descriptions about Rennyō, I cannot help but respect him for offering such warm-hearted hospitality to his Sangha.

Another famous aspect of his personality is the spirit of Hiraza. This means to treat all people equally

without discrimination. In other words, it means speaking frankly and acting with others as ordinary people, irrespective of being a minister or a member. Jōdo Shinshū in particular doesn't have the severe master-pupil relationship of some other Buddhist practices. Because of this, we are able to take others' happiness as our own happiness and others' sadness as our own, too. In this sharing of sadness and happiness, we can all experience the “world of the heart.” In Jōdo Shinshū, we call this spirit, Ondogyō-Ondobo. It can be interpreted as “Dharma friends...along the same Dharma path.”

In Chapter 9 of *Tannishō* (or *A Record in Lament of Divergences*), there is a famous question from Yūien-bo, a sincere disciple of Shinran Shōnin. Yūien-bo confessed to Shinran, “I rarely experience joyful happiness nor do I have the desire to immediately go to the Pure Land. What should be done about this?” I am sure that his obedient and sincere words posed a question that transcended the traditional relationship between master and pupil.

Many Buddhist sects teach people to enlightenment can only be attained through ascetic practices accomplished through one's own will power. This is known as *The Way of Sages* and it relies on a strict relationship between master and pupil where the master might respond to Yūien-bo's question with, “You should be ready to die whenever you die!” In contrast, Shinran Shōnin answered, “Yūien-bo, I have been asking myself the

same question. But we are grateful to Amida Buddha for his unconditional compassion. He made a vow to first save foolish beings like us who are always confused by love and hatred as we cling to life.”

Don't you think that his response illustrates the wonderful relationship between Shinran Shōnin and Yūien-bo?

The true spirit of Jōdo Shinshū is Hiraza. Our predecessors sincerely embraced the Nembutsu teaching and respected and supported one other as Ondogyō-Ondobo—Dharma travelers.

So in inheriting their great spirit, I want to serve the Mountain View Buddhist Temple Sangha not only sharing the Buddha Dharma from the podium, but also working side by side with you so that we may share our experiences in both good times and hard times.



And I hope that each of you will also will keep the spirit of Hiraza in mind and be respectful of all who are walking alongside you. Accept with a sincere heart all those who come to the temple as a Dharma friend. Whether we are minister, member, or first-time visitor, we have all chosen the same path.

jima has repeated a few times is "I will do my best" and it's a great reminder to me to try and always do your best.


He and his family are working very hard to acclimate to the new environment and have already become an integral part of the MVBT family.


