Preparing for Our Own Winter(Cont'd fr P.1)

Because the changing seasons are very distinct, New Jersey's climate is almost the same as that of Fukui Prefecture, my hometown. At times, one is surprised by the sudden change from cold to warm and vice versa, but spring is usually quite mild and has low rainfall, making it an easy place to live.

Summer brings hot and humid days which cause one much discomfort. Endless blue skies and brilliant leaves make autumn the most enjoyable time of year. Winter's arrival, with its sudden drop in temperature, continued cold and occasional snow, make it perhaps the most difficult season. Although it seldom snows in December, the cold goes from severe to worse as one endures the freezing temperatures. The frigid cold makes one eagerly anticipate the arrival of spring. Should anyone be contemplating a visit to New Jersey, I would certainly recommend going in the fall.

I served at Seabrook for a full year, so I had the opportunity to live in the midst of a natural environment that gave my spirit a wonderful education. Being among the many trees and plants with their beautiful blossoms nurtured by the warmth of the spring sun, I felt the joy of life. Having experienced the cool shade created by the towering trees that block the summer sun's hot rays, I was reminded of the strength of life. When the glorious leaves of late autumn fell, they demonstrated the impermanence of life. And the dignified towering trees stripped of their leaves in the winter cold taught me the dignity of life.

Throughout the four seasons of the year, the trees and flowers showed me all their different aspects. Living with Nature all around me in Seabrook encouraged me to think deeply about the meaning of life. It was a great joy that one can only experience when in close contact with Nature.

Of the four seasons, I find the falling leaves of late autumn most beautiful. When these leaves reach the end of their life span, they float down on the breezes without hesitation, as if invited by the ground below. This scene reminds me of Amida Buddha who, like Mother Earth, accepts all of our lives firmly and gently.



Close examination reveals that no two leaves are alike. Even when growing on the same tree, each leaf faces the sun at a slightly different angle. Each is affected differently by the wind as well. Whether in moonlight, starlight, or varying temperatures, each leaf has a different experience. When autumn arrives, each leaf changes color in its own way. Just as each

person lives his own life, each leaf has its own life which it lives to the fullest no matter what might happen. Even when buffeted by strong winds, a leaf does not give up its hold on the tree until its time has come. And in the end, each leaf celebrates the end of its life with blazing colors, extinguishing life's flame.

When I think deeply about it, I realize that we human beings, like the leaf, are ourselves a part of nature. Even though we have great worries about our lives, we can learn a valuable and precious lesson from observing the life cycle of the leaf.

The winter of our lives will not come in perfect order like the seasons. As I experience nature's changes, I sincerely want to treasure each moment and live my life to the fullest without hesitation. Are all of you prepared for your own winter? I sincerely hope that each of us will always observe closely the nature around us in order to feel and experience the changing of the four seasons.

In conclusion, I would like to express my deepest appreciation to all who have supported me and my family since we were assigned to the Mountain View Buddhist Temple on August 1st. We are so grateful to all of you for welcoming us warmly. We sincerely hope all of you will give us your continued guidance next year.
